Bring the family to explore this earth-friendly exhibit at Lied Discovery Children's Museum, on display in the Cultural Gallery from June 4 through September 25.

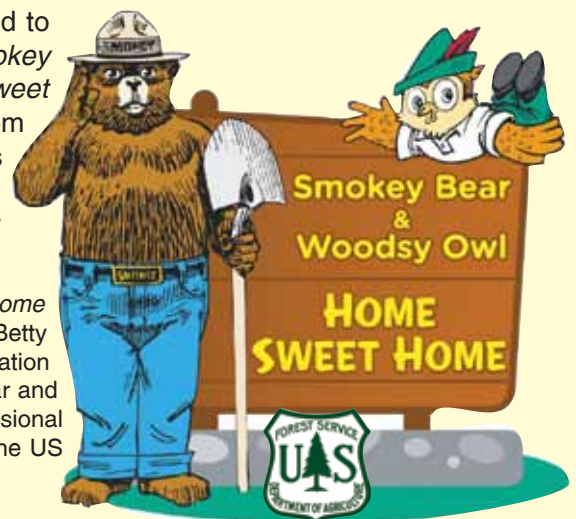

After breaking ground on its new facility in November, signs of the new DISCOVERY Children's Museum are popping out of the ground! Visible now from Grand Central Parkway are two completed elevator shaft towers and the beginnings of the new museum's exciting front facade.

The new children's museum is scheduled to open in November 2012. Located on the same campus as The Smith Center for the Performing Arts, the museum will be housed in a three-story, 58,000-square-foot stand-alone building named the Donald W. Reynolds Discovery Center. DISCOVERY Children's Museum will be home to nine new exhibit pavilions, including a 60-foot-tall climbing exhibit with unlimited interactive educational experiences branching off onto each floor.



Learn all about the human body through hands on activities and demonstrations. Then use dissection to compare animals to each other and our human body.

KIDS CHEMISTRY CONCOCTIONS (AGES 6-9)

Chemistry is FUN and it's for little kids too! From the food that we eat to the clothes that we wear to the toys that we play with – it is all around us. Join us in making hands-on investigations of how chemistry fits into our everyday lives and how we can use it to better understand the world in which we live. This camp is full of curious color changes, amazing ahh's and ooh's and maybe even a few special treats that you can eat!

MYSTERY OF PUPPETRY BY DRAMA KIDS INTERNATIONAL (AGES 6-9)

The art of puppetry takes center stage in this camp! Whether it's finger puppets, sock puppets, ventriloquists or marionettes, everyone loves to watch puppets on stage. Participants will have a blast creating Fandango puppet commercials and working on a ventriloquist act with a partner. New puppeteers will come to life as campers learn puppetry techniques!

NOT JUST ANY BODY – IT'S MY BODY (AGES 6-9)

Have you ever wondered what is really going on inside of your body? Hop on board a red blood cell and take a ride! We will pick up some oxygen from the lungs, then make a stop at the stomach and help digest some food. Along the way, we will check out the bones and muscles. PHYSICS FUN (AGES 6-9)

Come, get in the action and explore all of the reactions! Be prepared to build it! Break it! Bend it! Push it! Pull it! You name it! Exploring physics have never been more fun.

SCIENCE DETECTIVES (AGES 10-12)

Do you have what it takes to be a Science Detective? Let us help you sharpen those skills by trying your hand at interpreting evidence and solving a mystery! This camp is a twist on the popular Scholastic Series 39 Clues. We provide the clues and it is the camper's job to solve the mystery. Using textured glass tiles, explore the technique of “reverse” painting to create your very own design. Lots of fun!

Lunch Care: The museum is offering Lunch Care for those participants that want to take advantage of a morning and afternoon camp. Lunch care is offered free of charge when booking a morning and afternoon camp the same week. Lunch care is offered for only for \$25 for the week for half-day camps from 12 noon-1 p.m. Campers must bring a bag lunch as there are no facilities in the museum to purchase lunch; however we do have vending machines for snacks or drinks.

Cancellation Policy: Cancellations must be submitted in writing (mail, e-mail or fax). Cancellations will be processed as follows: Cancellation notice of 3 weeks (21 days) is required for a full refund. Cancellation notice of less than 3 weeks (21 days) but more than 2 weeks (14 days) will incur a \$75 cancellation fee. No refunds will be granted for cancellations made with less than 2 weeks (14 days) notice. Camps with low enrollment 2 weeks (14 days) prior to the start date are subject to cancellation. Minimum enrollment is required to run each camp. If cancellation occurs, the parent/guardian will be notified and given the opportunity to select another camp or receive a refund.

Registration Transfers: If you want to transfer your registration to a different camp, you must submit a request in writing (mail, email or fax) at least 2 weeks (14 days) prior to the start of the camp. Each camp transfer is subject to a \$25 fee. Registrations and fees are nontransferable between participants.

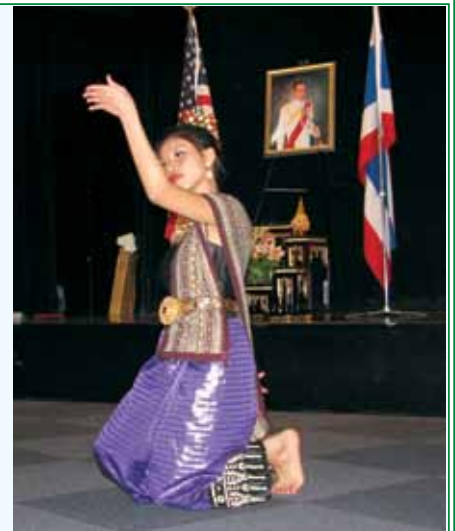
